DR. JOHN HULL

One of my key sources for trends happening in our culture and the subsequent impact on church-life is Thom Rainer at ThomRainer.com. Thom is a former LifeWay executive, prolific author, podcaster and a researcher with relevant data of what churches in America are currently experiencing in attendance and giving.

In a recent podcast, Thom shared some staggering data. He stated "83% of people will stay in your church after five years if they regularly come to both a group (Life Group, Sunday School class, small group, home group) and a worship service. But only 16% will stay in a church after five years, if they only come to the worship service."

This is a huge fact that can't be ignored. People who only attend a worship service are more likely to fade away. They don't leave because they are upset. Most often they leave because they never connected beyond the worship time. Getting people involved in a small group setting, according to Rainer's research, reveals they are five times more likely to stay rooted into the life of the church.

Here we are at Eastside launching a brand new year and another decade -2020! You have the wonderful opportunity to engage with a group of people and do life together. Care and concern, prayer, studying God's Word, accountability, encouragement and having fun all factor into what a healthy Life Group gets done on a weekly basis.

Our Life Groups at Eastside are categorized either by age or topic. There is a point of commonality in each class. There are seasonal and recreational gatherings beyond Sundays.

Josh Rice is a familiar face on the platform. We are blessed to have such a gifted communicator as part of our teaching team. Since our move to the former Olive Springs campus in Smyrna, Mosaic has been hosting various congregations on its grounds. Two congregations hold services on Sunday mornings. - Eastside's Mosaic Church, led by Campus Pastor Adrian Coetzer, meets at 10:30am in the Chapel and Eastside's Brazilian Church, led by Campus Pastor Lindolfo Dossantos, meets at 11:00am in the Worship Center. They share children's ministry efforts. At 1:30pm. Eastside's Salem Haitian Baptist Church meets and on Tuesday evenings at 8:00pm Mosaic en Espanol, led by Campus Pastor Adrian Coetzer, finds its home on our Mosaic campus.

On any given week there is in excess of 300 people worshipping on the Mosaic campus and we are discovering that we are truly better together!

During the week, our Mosaic campus operates as a Community Ministry and Resource Center. We have identified specific needs in the community that we are working to address either directly or through partnerships with organizations such as MUST, Storehouse Ministries, Feed My Lambs, and Good Samaritan Community Clinic, most of whom are hosted on Mosaic campus.

On November 16th, our partner churches and our community partners joined together to host a campus-wide Fall Community Festival. Between the bounce-houses, delicious Brazilian food, and the ever-popular fried Oreos, the event was a tremendous success! Over 500 people from many families enjoyed this wonderful day. We are excited to see what the Lord will do in our community through the ministry of Eastside Mosaic.

"Thirty years ago God made it very clear to Charlotte Ware and me that we were to help spearhead a ministry at Eastside with the sole intent of helping people in need in our church and community. It was to be more than just words, it was boots on the ground, providing food, shelter, bill paying, transportation whatever would help people out of a bad situation in the name of Jesus. Eastside's Caring Ministry was underway and over the years our church has made a huge difference in the lives of thousands of people."

2020 will bring some wonderful new changes to this vital ministry. The Caring Ministry has relocated to Eastside's Mosaic campus and alongside Campus Pastor Adrian Coetzer, is broadening our influence in the community. Here are a few examples:

There are ten schools within the five-mile radius of Eastside's Mosaic campus where many parents struggle to provide food for their children. In conjunction with Storehouse Ministries, the Caring Ministry is providing organization and labor to prepare lunches and distribute them in the area.

One block from the church is a free Health Clinic where people daily stand in long lines waiting to be seen. We want to make sure they have a good lunch so we are providing sandwiches for hungry people.

We are assisting, along with Eastside Life Groups, to provide help in a newly designed Computer Lab in the church building. People looking for jobs online are finding opportunities and application assistance.

At teacher direction, selected students at two local schools, Dunleigh Elementary School and Fair Oaks Elementary will be able to take home a "Blessing Bag" on Fridays with non-perishable food items for their families. We will also help to provide uniform clothing for children.

Eastside's Mosaic church building gives us many opportunities for outreach in the community by providing space for graduation ceremonies, PTA conferences, musical performances, etc. As we assist with parking and greeting, we extend the invitation to attend one of Eastside's seven Sunday services.

While this wonderful community involvement is taking place, the Caring Ministry's primary focus remains on our church members. We are here to help with needed home repairs, such as heat and air, rent checks, medical bills, insurance payments, transportation needs, furniture and food. Whatever and however we can come alongside you in a crisis moment is our desire. We care.

"There have been many miracle stories over the years but what I find most amazing is that the Caring Ministry is non-budgeted ministry. Several times a year there is an appeal to donate to the Caring Ministry and God supplies. He provides what we need long before we even know we need it and uses your generous hearts and funds to make it happen."

## **ESL AT EASTSIDE**

### English as a Second Language

What better way to share the love of Jesus than to speak His name together? But to do that you have to speak the same language! That's the beauty of hosting the ESL Program on both of our campuses.

We asked instructor Amanda Durski to give us her experience working with this wonderful ministry. She and her husband Tim, along with several other instructors under the leadership of Eastside's Brazilian Campus Pastor, Lindolfo Dossantos, are making a difference in many people's lives. "Even though there are language barriers, we still have fun and laugh and learn about our different languages and cultures. The students often teach us some Spanish and Portuguese which is a great reminder that learning a new language is very difficult! Tim and I are excited that we can help make someone's life in the United States a little easier."

ESL at Eastside currently has four classes helping at different levels of proficiency. Two to three instructors lead students through lessons on speaking, listening, reading and writing in English. Vocabulary and grammar instruction is incorporated in each lesson.

"The students have a workbook but we make sure each week that we teach English through scripture and Bible stories. It is a casual environment where students can build their confidence, have fun, and make friends, as they practice English. But the greatest joy for all of us is that many are becoming Christians as they are introduced to God's love through the ESL class."

On our Lower Roswell campus, our ESL classes currently average 30-40 students meeting each Wednesday night, and on our Mosaic campus we host over 45 students. They represent countries such as Brazil, Colombia, Costa Rica, Dominican Republic, Mexico, and more. The primary languages represented are Portuguese and Spanish, but all languages are welcome!
